Heating System Maintenance Checklist

- 1. Schedule annual professional servicing before the heating season.
- 2. Replace or clean filters (monthly for furnaces during peak use).
- 3. Inspect and clean ductwork for blockages and debris.
- 4. Check for air leaks around windows and doors; seal as needed.
- 5. Inspect thermostat functionality and calibrate settings.
- 6. Bleed radiators to remove trapped air (for boiler systems).
- 7. Clear the area around heating units to ensure proper airflow.
